



## Haiti Earthquake Disaster Relief Project

Snelling Staffing Services has been contracted to provide staffing for FEMA's Haitian refugee temporary housing project. We're actively looking for people who can commit immediately to 6+ weeks in south Florida. Positions include general helpers, project managers, cooks, dishwashers, administrative assistants, general laborers, construction workers, and machine/equipment operators. You must be willing to work long hours in a fast pace, sometimes stressful environment. This is a massive effort and we will select those who express desire to any job asked of them.

FEMA scouts are currently identifying areas where these "camps" will be located. After they have been selected, workers will be notified and expected to reach the site in around 24 – 72 hours.

We are anticipating 5 or more camps each requiring up to 200 workers. Each camp is supervised by FEMA Project Managers and several assistants. Our helpers report to and take direction from either the Project Manager or a specialized subcontractor to which they are assigned.

Helpers are expected to do any tasks assigned and work 7 days/week, 12 hours/day, or approximately 84 hours per week. The rate of pay will depend on the job assigned and will equal the federal prevailing wage for the specific job in the designated geographic area. Time plus ½ will be paid on all hours worked over 40 per week. You must provide your own transportation to and from the camp, and will receive housing, personal care facilities and all meals. You will also receive \$3.23 per hour (on the first 40 hours), for a health & welfare benefit. Typical weekly earnings are expected to be from \$975 - \$1500 per week.

Other requirements for the position include a working cell phone, an email account that can be accessed by remote, and the ability to have your paycheck direct deposited.

This opportunity has remarkable benefits for many people. Here is a way individuals can contribute by providing critical resources for our less fortunate friends from Haiti. At the same time it is an opportunity to help so many talented but unemployed individuals temporarily boost their financial resources.

The opportunity is not for everybody. The conditions will appear chaotic at times and you will be dealing with traumatized people from a developing country, many of whom do not speak English. We anticipate that the facilities will be as safe as possible, with adequate security, military and medical personnel on hand.
